# Wait continues for Creswell Grove & Marston Grange Development Plans

The two major planning applications in the Parish, the application on Creswell Grove (pictured above) and the application next to Marston Grange for up to 700 dwellings and other facilities, are still to be decided by Stafford Borough Council. We understand that both decisions are delayed in order that more information can be supplied to the Council and some statuatory bodies.

The Parish Council have replied to both applications and have raised local concerns about the lack of information sent to some residents. Local residents have also been making their feelings known to the local authorities.

We have been told that both applications should be coming close to a decision soon.

#### **Tributes Paid To Parish Stalwart**

Tributes have been paid to Peter McNamara, who served the residents of Creswell so well over many years. Peter passed away earlier this year and is very much missed by the community.

For many years, Peter led the Neighbourhood Watch in the village, keeping everyone informed and encouraging new initiatives. He was involved in many aspects of life in the Parish and of Stafford as a whole and we owe him a great debt.

Parish Council Chairman, Cllr. Maria Redfern, commented: "Peter has always been one of those people who was always there, always helping or wanting to know how he could help. He will be sorely missed but his contribution to our community will live on."

#### **New Proposal for Storage Unit on Redhill**

A planning application has been submitted for the erection of a new selfstorage facility and office accommodation with associated car parking and external works on the Redhill Business Park.

The application, submitted by local company 'Storage Boost', would see a four story building erected at the entrance to the business park, just off the A34 Stone Road.

The Parish Council have responded, citing concerns about visual, light and noise disturbance for local residents at Marston Grange and Redhill. Concerns have also been raised about the amount of jobs that will be created in a self-storage facility. The Redhill business park was established on the basis of job creation.
